Disconnection

- Avoid looking directly at the fiber end when the laser signal is active to prevent eye injury .

Cleaning and Maintenance

- Clean the ferrule and end face with alcohol and lint-free cotton or specialized fiber cleaning tools before use .
- Regular inspection for dust, dirt, or damage is essential to maintain signal integrity .
- Use appropriate cleaning methods, such as reel-to-reel cleaners, wet wipes with alcohol, dry cloths, or swab cleaners .

Storage and Protection

- Store cords without bending beyond the recommended radius and avoid placing them under heavy objects .
- Protect connectors with dust caps when not in use to prevent contamination and mechanical damage .
- Avoid environmental hazards such as extreme temperatures, moisture, or chemical exposure that can degrade the cable materials .

Safety Measures

- Wear protective glasses and gloves to prevent injury from fiber shards or accidental contact with laser light .
- Use anti-static wrist straps when handling active devices to prevent electrostatic discharge damage .
