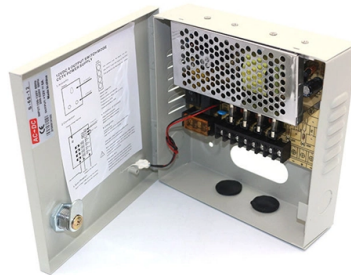


Cable tray bottom support principle
