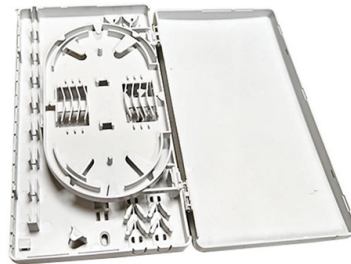


Can a router be used with whole-house fiber optic internet How much does it cost

Router Hardware Costs

For a home fiber network, the router itself is the primary hardware component. Prices vary based on speed, coverage, and advanced features:
