Typical plug-in power strips, also called relocatable power taps, are designed to connect to a permanently installed branch-circuit receptacle outlet, not directly to a distribution box or circuit panel. They are intended for temporary indoor use with small appliances or electronics, and their cords should remain straight and unobstructed. Using them with high-capacity appliances or permanently securing them to structures violates UL and OSHA guidelines and can create fire hazards. Daisy-chaining multiple strips or connecting them to extension cords is also prohibited.

Hardwired Power Strips

Hardwired or direct-wire power strips are designed to be permanently connected to a building's electrical system and can be installed in workshops, entertainment centers, or commercial settings . These units can handle higher loads and provide a more stable power supply. However, installation requires a licensed electrician to ensure proper grounding, circuit capacity, and compliance with electrical codes . Some models include built-in breakers for additional safety.

Safety Considerations

- **Load Capacity:** Never exceed the amperage rating of the circuit or the power strip. High-capacity appliances like microwaves, heaters, or refrigerators should not be connected to power strips .
- **Surge Protection:** Not all power strips provide surge protection. Only use strips explicitly labeled as surge protectors if protection is needed .
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Power strips are not a substitute for fixed wiring and should not be routed through walls, ceilings, or floors . OSHA and UL standards specify that power strips are for temporary, indoor use and must be installed according to their listing .

While hardwired power strips can be safely integrated with electrical distribution systems when installed by a professional, standard plug-in power strips should never be connected directly to distribution boxes. Always follow UL, OSHA, and local electrical codes to prevent overloads, fire hazards, and equipment damage.
