- Air-Insulated Switchgear (AIS)
 - Uses atmospheric air as the insulating medium between live parts and ground.
 - Requires more physical space, making it suitable for outdoor or rural installations.
 - Advantages: Simple design, cost-effective, easy maintenance.
 - Applications: Outdoor substations, long-distance transmission systems .
- Gas-Insulated Switchgear (GIS)
 - Uses SF₆ gas for insulation, enclosing all live parts in grounded metal compartments.

Classification by Circuit Breaker Technology

High-voltage switchgear incorporates different types of circuit breakers to interrupt fault currents safely:

- Vacuum Circuit Breaker (VCB): Extinguishes arcs in a vacuum; suitable for medium to high voltage.
- SF₆ Circuit Breaker: Uses sulfur hexafluoride gas for insulation and arc quenching; common in GIS.
- Air Circuit Breaker (ACB): Uses air as the arc quenching medium; typically for lower HV ranges.
- Oil Circuit Breaker (OCB): Uses insulating oil to quench arcs; traditional technology still used in some installations .

Classification by Assembly Design

- Fixed Type Cubicles
- Switchgear is permanently connected to the main circuit.
- Requires de-energizing the circuit for maintenance or intervention .
- Withdrawable (Draw-Out) Type Cubicles
- Switchgear can be mechanically withdrawn from the cubicle while still connected to the main circuit.
- Allows safe maintenance or inspection without fully de-energizing the system .

Core Components of HV Switchgear

- Circuit Breakers (CBs): Automatically interrupt fault currents.
- Disconnectors/Isolators: Physically separate equipment for maintenance.
- Current Transformers (CTs) & Potential Transformers (PTs): Measure current and voltage for monitoring and protection.
- Protective Relays: Detect abnormal conditions and trigger breakers.
- Busbars: Distribute power within the switchgear.
- Earthing Switches: Safely discharge residual currents.
- Control Panels & Indicators: Interface for monitoring and operational control .

Applications

High-voltage complete sets of equipment are used in:

- Power Generation Stations: Protecting generators and outgoing lines.
- Transmission Substations: Connecting different voltage levels and routing power.
- Distribution Substations: Stepping down voltage for local distribution.
