- Tension management: Avoid excessive pulling forces; use proper cable guides and supports .

- Labeling and organization: Clearly label and color-code cables to simplify troubleshooting and future upgrades .
- Use appropriate termination boxes: Wall-mount or rack-mounted enclosures protect splices and connectors while maintaining signal integrity .

Cleaning and Contamination Control

Contaminants such as dust, oil, or debris on connector endfaces can degrade signal quality or damage optical surfaces . Recommended cleaning practices include:

- Use Clean Dry Air (CDA) or filtered compressed air to remove loose particles .
- Apply spectroscopic-grade isopropyl alcohol on lens tissue for stubborn contaminants .
- Avoid touching fiber ends with fingers or allowing contact with surfaces .
- Protect connectors with dust caps when not in use .
- Inspect with magnifiers or video inspection tools only when necessary, and never look directly into active fiber links .

Testing and Monitoring

- OTDR (Optical Time-Domain Reflectometer) and Visual Fault Locators can be used to verify cable integrity during installation or after suspected damage .
- Routine testing of live networks is generally discouraged unless troubleshooting a fault, as unnecessary disconnection can disrupt service .
- Network equipment often includes built-in monitoring for signal errors, reducing the need for manual inspection .

Lifecycle and Replacement

- Monitor for physical damage: Fiber strain, connector wear, or water ingress can cause faults .
- Replace damaged sections promptly to maintain network performance .
- Plan for lifecycle management: Consider cable type (single-mode vs. multi-mode), installation environment, and expected network growth when selecting and maintaining cables .

Safety Considerations

- Laser safety: Never look directly into fiber ends or active transceivers; high-power lasers can cause eye damage .
- Proper PPE: Use gloves and eye protection when handling fibers and cleaning chemicals .

- Avoid unnecessary connector mating/unmating: Excessive cycles can wear ferrules and adapters, increasing insertion loss .
Standards and Compliance
- Follow TIA/EIA-568 standards for termination, labeling, and structured cabling .
- ITU-T L.25 provides guidance on optical fiber network maintenance, including fault origins like fiber loss, strain, and water penetration .
