The outer jacket of a fiber optic cable indicates the type of fiber inside:

- Single-mode fibers (SM): Yellow jacket
- Multimode OM1/OM2: Orange jacket
- Multimode OM3/OM4: Aqua jacket
- Multimode OM4 (high-performance variant): Erika Violet or bright violet
- Indoor cables with laser-optimized 50/125 μm MM fiber: Aqua
- Polarization-maintaining fibers: Blue jacket

- Outdoor cables: Typically black for UV resistance, with printed legends for identification .

Individual Fiber Color Coding

Inside a cable, each fiber is color-coded to allow easy identification. The standard 12-color sequence under TIA/EIA-598C is:

- Blue
- Orange
- Green
- Brown
- Slate
- White
- Red
- Black
- Yellow
- Violet
- Rose
- Aqua For cables with more than 12 fibers, the sequence repeats with black stripes added to maintain unique identification. Some high-density or European standards extend the sequence to 16 fibers with additional colors like Olive, Magenta, Tan, and Lime .

Connector Color Coding

Fiber connectors are also color-coded to indicate polish type:

- UPC (Ultra Physical Contact): Blue connector, flat polish
- APC (Angled Physical Contact): Green connector, 8-degree angled polish It is crucial never to mix UPC and APC connectors, as the mismatch can permanently damage the fiber core .

Buffer Tube and Ribbon Colors

In loose-tube or ribbon cables, buffer tubes or ribbons are color-coded using the same 12-color sequence. This helps technicians identify fibers within multi-fiber cables, splice trays, or patch panels, especially in high-density installations with dozens or hundreds of fibers .
