- Professional Installation: Labels should be applied neatly and securely; consulting a licensed electrician is recommended for compliance and safety .

- Extended downtime and costly repairs due to misidentification
- Non-compliance with NEC, OSHA, or NFPA standards, potentially resulting in fines or failed inspections
