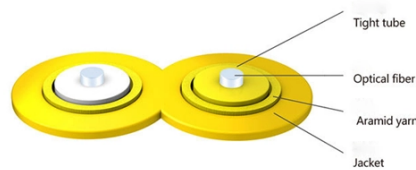

1. Visual Inspection Before testing, perform a visual check for obvious damage such as cuts, kinks, or damaged jackets. Use a fiber optic microscope to inspect connector end faces for scratches, chips, or contamination. Ensure the fiber is clean and free of debris, as even minor contamination can cause significant signal loss.
2. OTDR Testing (Optical Time Domain Reflectometer) OTDR is the primary tool for locating faults and verifying repair quality. It sends light pulses through the fiber and measures reflections to identify breaks, microbends, macrobends, and splice losses. After repair, OTDR testing confirms that splice loss is minimal (ideally
