How Fiber and Ethernet Integration Works

Fiber optic routers receive data as light signals transmitted through fiber cables. Ethernet cables, on the other hand, carry electrical signals. To connect a fiber-ready router to an Ethernet network, the optical signals must be converted into electrical signals that Ethernet devices can interpret. This is typically done using an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), media converters, or SFP/SFP+ transceivers .
