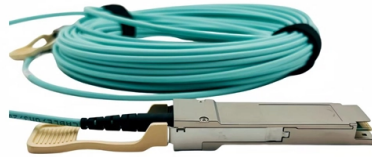


Fiber Optic Cable Marking

Fiber optic cables often feature printed information along the outer jacket that provides critical details for installers and technicians. Typical markings include the manufacturer name, product type, date of manufacture, serial number, fiber count, fiber type (singlemode or multimode), buffer diameter, cable diameter, weight, minimum bend radius, and maximum pulling tension. Some cables also include distance markers to track how much cable has been deployed or remains on a reel, which is especially useful for fusion splicing and outdoor installations .

Fiber Color Coding



Individual fibers inside a cable are identified using standardized color codes, following the TIA-598-D standard. The 12-color sequence for fibers is: 1-Blue, 2-Orange, 3-Green, 4-Brown, 5-Slate (Gray), 6-White, 7-Red, 8-Black, 9-Yellow, 10-Violet, 11-Rose, 12-Aqua. For cables with more than 12 fibers, the sequence repeats across buffer tubes, using a “Tube and Fiber” system. For example, in a 144-fiber cable, fiber #45 would be the 9th fiber (Yellow) in the 4th tube (Brown) . The outer jacket color also indicates fiber type: for instance, yellow jackets typically signify singlemode fibers (OS1/OS2), while other colors may indicate multimode fibers (OM1/OM5), .

Labeling Methods

In addition to printed legends and color codes, specialized labels are used for identification in dense installations, such as flag labels, wrap-around labels, and thermal-printed labels. These labels are designed to avoid damaging the delicate fiber core, fit small diameters, and remain legible in tight spaces like patch panels or data centers. Dual-sided printing and pre-cut designs improve visibility and speed of application, while thermal printing systems allow high-volume labeling with consistent results .
