Bend Radius and Mechanical Stress Fiber optic cables are sensitive to excessive bending, pulling, or crushing. When deploying without a reel, ensure that the cable is never bent more sharply than its minimum bend radius, and avoid kinks or twists. Use “figure-8” loops when laying cable on the ground to prevent twisting and maintain structural integrity. Avoid pulling the cable over sharp edges or rough surfaces, and minimize mechanical pressure at crossing points, especially for armored or LSZH-sheathed cables, which are more prone to cracking under stress or high temperatures .

Alternative Deployment Methods Lightweight modular systems, such as the OCC Modular Advanced Reel System (MARS®), can be used to deploy fiber without traditional heavy reels. These systems allow for quick deployment, storage, and retrieval using backpacks, tripods, or portable frames, making them suitable for field installations where reels are impractical . For short runs or compact setups, bend-insensitive fibers like G.657.A2 are recommended, as they tolerate tighter routing and repeated handling without significant signal loss .

Cutting and Respooling If the cable must be cut or respooled, use sharp tools to make clean, right-angle cuts. Always verify the cable type and length before cutting. When respooling, select a take-up drum with sufficient diameter to maintain the minimum bend radius, typically at least 30 times the cable outer diameter, to prevent damage and high attenuation . Inspect all surfaces and equipment for objects that could damage the cable during handling.

Environmental Protection When fiber is left outdoors or exposed during installation, protect it from UV, moisture, and mechanical damage. Use protective sheaths or temporary coverings if the cable will remain outside for extended periods. Ensure the installation area is free of sharp rocks or debris that could compromise the cable sheath .

- Avoid dragging the cable across rough terrain.
- Use lightweight, portable deployment aids if reels are unavailable.
- Maintain careful records of cable lengths and handling procedures.
- For dense or compact installations, consider bend-insensitive fiber to reduce the risk of signal loss. By following these guidelines, fiber optic cable can be safely installed and managed without a traditional reel, ensuring both mechanical protection and optimal signal performance.
