- Optical Network Terminal (ONT): Provided by your ISP, converts fiber signals into electrical signals your router can use ().
- Fiber optic cable: Usually a thin yellow cable with SC/APC or SC/UPC connectors ().
- Ethernet cable: To connect the ONT to your router ().
- Fiber-ready router: Ensure it supports gigabit speeds or higher to fully leverage fiber performance ().

- Power adapters for both ONT and router.

Step 2: Connect the Fiber Optic Cable

- Locate the fiber wall outlet where the ISP's fiber line enters your home ().
- Remove protective caps from both the fiber cable and the ONT port.

- Carefully insert the fiber cable into the ONT's optical port until it clicks securely (). Handle the connector by its plastic housing to avoid damage.

Step 3: Link ONT to Router

- Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port to the WAN/Internet port on your router ().

- Place both devices near a power source in a dry, ventilated area, ideally protected by a surge suppressor ().

Step 4: Power On Devices

- Power on the ONT first and wait for the status lights to stabilize (usually 2-5 minutes) ().

- Power on the router and wait for its indicator lights to confirm a successful connection.

Step 5: Configure the Router

- Access the router's admin panel via a web browser (commonly 192.168.1.1 or 192.168.0.1) ().

- Set up your Wi-Fi network name (SSID) and password.

- Enable security protocols such as WPA3 or WPA2 for protection.

- Optionally, configure Quality of Service (QoS) to prioritize traffic for streaming, gaming, or video calls ().

Step 6: Test and Optimize

- Check internet speed and connectivity on multiple devices ().

- Update firmware for both the ONT and router to ensure optimal performance ().

- Position the router centrally to maximize Wi-Fi coverage and reduce interference ().

- For critical applications, consider using wired Ethernet connections for lower latency (). By following these steps, your fiber optic internet connection will be properly established, providing high-speed, low-latency performance for both wired and wireless devices.

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
