For floor-mounted distribution boxes, the base should generally be 2 to 4 inches above the floor to prevent water damage and allow for proper ventilation and maintenance access. This height ensures the box is protected from minor spills, cleaning activities, or condensation while remaining accessible for inspection and operation. In residential settings, the overall height of the box is often around 1.5 meters (approximately 4.9 feet) from the floor to the top or centerline, which balances accessibility and safety, keeping it out of reach of children while allowing adults to operate it comfortably. In industrial or commercial environments, the height may be adjusted depending on surrounding equipment, workflow, and safety requirements.

- Accessibility: Ensure the box is easy to reach for maintenance, label reading, and emergency operation without excessive bending or stretching.
