- Respect the Minimum Bend Radius: Fiber optic cables are sensitive to sharp bends. Always maintain a bend radius at least ten times the cable diameter, typically no less than 30mm for most cables, to prevent signal loss or breakage .
- Choose a Coiling Method:
 - Over-Under Method: Alternate the direction of each loop to prevent twists and tangles. This method is ideal for longer cables and helps maintain the cable's natural shape .
 - Figure-Eight Method: Useful for shorter cables, this method creates a compact coil and reduces mechanical stress .
 - Splice Tray Coiling: For cables with splices or pigtails, coil the fiber in a splice tray starting from the middle and then both sides, or from one end, ensuring heat-shrink sleeves and joints are protected .
 - Pre-Treatment: Strip and clean the fiber ends carefully before coiling. Insert fiber protection sleeves over spliced sections to prevent damage .

- **Secure the Coil:** Use Velcro straps, cable ties, or twist ties to hold the coil in place. Avoid overtightening, which can crush the fiber . For splice trays, adhesive cable tie seats can help fix the fiber without stressing it .

- **Avoid Overstretching:** Coil the fiber naturally according to its length and the available storage space. Do not pull hard, as tension can damage the fiber or affect signal quality .

- **Special Considerations:** If the leftover fiber is unusually long or short, or connected to special optical devices, coil it separately and use buffer pads to prevent extrusion or crushing .

Storage and Future Use

- Label and document leftover fiber lengths for restoration kits or future projects .

- Store coiled fiber in a clean, dry environment to prevent contamination or mechanical damage.

- Avoid stacking heavy objects on coiled fiber to maintain integrity. By following these steps, leftover fiber optic cable can be safely coiled, stored, and reused without compromising performance or durability .
