- **Connect Fiber to Patch Panel:** Use SC to LC duplex fiber cables to link the router ports to the corresponding ports on the fiber patch panel. Each LAN port may connect to multiple patch panel ports depending on network design .
- **Link to ONT (if required):** For ISP-provided fiber, the optical signal may terminate at an Optical Network Terminal (ONT). Connect the fiber cable to the ONT's optical port, then use an Ethernet cable from the ONT to the router's WAN port .
- **Power and Configuration:** Power on the ONT first, wait for the optical link to stabilize, then power on the router. Access the router's admin interface to configure WAN settings, VLANs, or Quality of Service (QoS) as needed .

#### Best Practices

- **Handle Fiber Carefully:** Avoid touching the fiber tip; dust or scratches can degrade signal quality .
- **Verify Compatibility:** Ensure the SFP/GBIC module matches the fiber type and distance requirements (e.g., 1000BaseSX for multi-mode, 1000BaseLX for single-mode) .
- **Check Status Lights:** Confirm the router and ONT indicators show active connections (solid green or blue lights) .
- **Environmental Considerations:** Place the router and ONT in a dry, ventilated area with surge protection . By following these steps, an enterprise router can reliably interface with a fiber optic network, ensuring high-speed, low-latency connectivity suitable for demanding enterprise applications.
