A pigtail is a short wire, typically 6-8 inches long, used to connect a device (like an outlet or switch) to the main circuit wires inside an electrical box. This method isolates the device from the continuous circuit path, preventing a single device failure from affecting downstream outlets and maintaining circuit integrity . - Check Connection: Ensure the splice is tight, with no bare copper exposed, and gently tug each wire to confirm security .

- Disconnect Power: Remove the negative battery terminal or de-energize the circuit .
- Strip and Match Wires: Strip insulation from both the existing harness and the new pigtail, ensuring correct gauge and color matching .
