Cable internet typically shares bandwidth among multiple households, which can increase the chance of data leakage or congestion-related vulnerabilities (Glo Fiber), . Fiber's low latency and minimal packet loss also support secure real-time communications, which is important for encryption protocols and secure transactions (TechRepublic), .

Encryption and Cybersecurity

While the physical medium contributes to safety, overall internet security also depends on encryption protocols (like SSL/TLS), ISP security practices, and user behavior. Both fiber and cable can use strong encryption, but fiber's higher bandwidth and dedicated lines make it easier to maintain secure, uninterrupted data transmission (Glo Fiber), .

Environmental and Long-Term Considerations

Fiber optic cables are more resilient to environmental factors such as weather, which reduces the likelihood of outages or physical damage that could compromise data integrity. Cable lines are more prone to signal degradation over long distances and interference from external sources (Wolontek), .
