Before attempting to open any junction box, turn off the power at the circuit breaker and verify with a non-contact voltage tester that no live current is present inside the box . This prevents electric shock and ensures safe handling of internal components.

Tools Required

- Hex key (Allen wrench) matching the size of the internal hex screws
- Insulated screwdriver (optional, for other screws)
- Non-contact voltage tester
- Pliers (for wire handling if needed)

Steps to Open the Junction Box

- **Locate the Hex Screws:** Identify the screws holding the junction box cover or internal components. These are typically recessed and require a hex key .
- **Insert the Hex Key:** Fit the hex key snugly into the screw head to avoid stripping.

- **Turn Counterclockwise:** Rotate the hex key slowly to loosen and remove the screws. Keep the screws in a safe place for reassembly.
 - **Remove the Cover:** Gently lift the cover or internal panel to access the wiring inside. Ensure wires are not pulled or stressed.

Additional Tips

- Use a magnetized hex key if screws are small to prevent dropping them inside the box.
- Avoid over-tightening screws to prevent cracking plastic covers or stripping threads.
- If the junction box is metal, ensure proper grounding connections are maintained when reassembling . Following these steps allows safe and effective access to a junction box with an internal hex socket, while minimizing the risk of electrical hazards.
