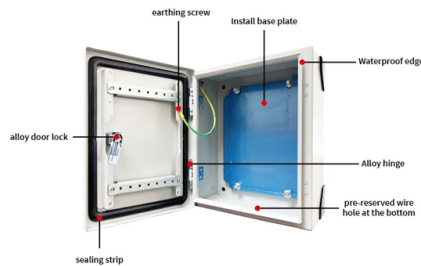

Avoid piling soil or mulch directly against the box, and keep a clearance of 3-5 feet in front and 1-2 feet on the sides. Large trees or shrubs with deep roots should be avoided to prevent damage to underground wiring. Contact your local utility or use services like 811 before planting to mark underground utilities.

- **Plant Selection:** Use small shrubs, ornamental grasses, or potted plants with shallow roots to avoid interference with underground cables. Plants like Adagio Maiden Grass or Miscanthus are suitable for disguising boxes without sharp edges.
- **Trellises and Fencing:** Install a trellis or low fence around the box to support climbing plants or create a visual barrier while keeping access clear.



- **Movable Screens:** Consider movable planters or decorative panels that can be repositioned for maintenance access .
