

Raw materials for cable trays



Overview

Several types of tray are used in different applications. A solid-bottom tray provides the maximum protection to cables, but requires cutting the tray or using fittings to enter or exit cables. A deep, solid enclosure for cables is called a cable channel or cable trough. A ventilated tray has openings in the bottom of the tray, allowing some air circulation around the cables, water drainage, and allowing some dust to fall through the tray. Small cables may exit the tray through.

Galvanized Steel: Widely used due to its affordability and structural strength, galvanized steel is suitable for industrial and commercial applications. It provides long durability with low maintenance and is effective in environments where mechanical protection is needed. Hot-dip galvanization enhances corrosion resistance, and increasing coating thickness can extend service life by 5–8 years in harsh environments . **Aluminum:** Aluminum trays, often made from 6063-T5 alloy, are lightweight (about 42% lighter than steel) and offer excellent corrosion resistance due to the self-healing aluminum oxide layer. They are ideal for data centers and environments requiring high conductivity, though they are typically 65% more expensive than galvanized steel . **Stainless Steel:** Stainless steel trays provide high strength, chemical resistance, and heat tolerance. They are suitable for corrosive or high-temperature environments and offer additional safety in fire-prone areas. Low electrical conductivity reduces the risk of electrical surges affecting the cables . **Fiberglass and Composites:** Fiberglass trays are used in highly corrosive or acidic conditions, such as chemical plants or refineries. They are lightweight, non-conductive, and reduce maintenance costs significantly, as demonstrated in projects like CNPC's Zhanjiang Refining, where maintenance costs dropped by 82% over three years .

Material Considerations

- **Thickness and Strength:** Steel trays for heavy-duty applications typically use Q235B steel with a minimum thickness of 1.5 mm and yield strength ≥ 235 MPa . Aluminum and stainless steel thicknesses vary depending on load and environmental requirements.
- **Surface Treatments:** Coatings like hot-dip galvanization, nano-ceramic, or painting improve corrosion resistance and longevity .
- **Cost Factors:** Steel costs depend on raw materials like iron ore and coke, while aluminum and stainless steel are influenced by alloy composition and processing methods .
