Future Expansion: Plan for additional circuits or components by reserving around 20–30% extra space inside the distribution box. This allows for easy upgrades, integration of smart modules, or additional breakers without costly modifications later.

Location and Accessibility: Install the box in a dry, well-ventilated area at an accessible height (typically ~1.5 meters for residential or office setups). Ensure it is easy to reach for maintenance and inspection.

Box Type and Environment: Choose the appropriate type of distribution box based on the environment. For indoor use, plastic or steel enclosures are common, while outdoor or industrial settings require waterproof, dustproof, and temperature-resistant boxes with proper IP/NEMA ratings.

Cable Management and Reserve: Allocate space for cable routing and reserves.
