Modern crimpers are often multifunctional, combining cutting, stripping, and crimping in a single tool, which simplifies the assembly of custom patch cables . These are particularly useful when creating flexible patch cables or custom-length cables for network installations.

Punch-Down Tools



For patch panels that use keystone jacks or 110/ Krone-style connections, a punch-down tool is used instead of a crimper. This tool inserts and secures individual wires into the slots of the patch panel or keystone jack, cutting off excess wire and ensuring a reliable electrical connection . Punch-down tools come in different types, including impact tools and insertion tools, and are essential for structured cabling in professional network setups.
