Locate the fiber optic port: Look on your router for the port designated for the fiber optic connection.

The fiber optic connection does not plug directly into most home routers; it connects first to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which then links to the router via the WAN or Internet port.

Understanding the Connection
Fiber optic internet uses light signals that standard routers cannot directly interpret. The fiber cable from your ISP terminates at an ONT, a small device usually installed near the point where the fiber enters your home. The ONT converts the optical signal into an electrical signal compatible with your router .

Identifying the Router Port

Once the ONT converts the signal, you connect it to your router using a standard Ethernet cable. The correct port on your router is typically labeled WAN, Internet, or sometimes Fiber. It is usually located on the back of the router and may be color-coded to distinguish it from LAN ports . Some fiber-ready routers have a dedicated SFP or PON port for direct fiber input, but this is less common in standard home setups .

Connection Steps

- Connect the fiber cable to the ONT: Remove protective caps and carefully insert the fiber connector into the ONT's optical port, ensuring a secure click .
- Link the ONT to the router: Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN or Ethernet output port to the router's WAN/Internet port .
- Power on devices: Plug in and power the ONT and router. Wait for the status lights to stabilize, indicating a successful connection .
- Configure the router: Access the router's admin panel via a web browser and enter any ISP credentials if required .

Tips

- Check your router's manual for port labels and compatibility with fiber connections.
- Handle fiber connectors carefully to avoid damage or dirt contamination.
- Ensure both the ONT and router are placed near power outlets in a dry, ventilated area . By following these steps, you can correctly identify and use the router's port for fiber optic internet, ensuring a stable and high-speed connection.

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
