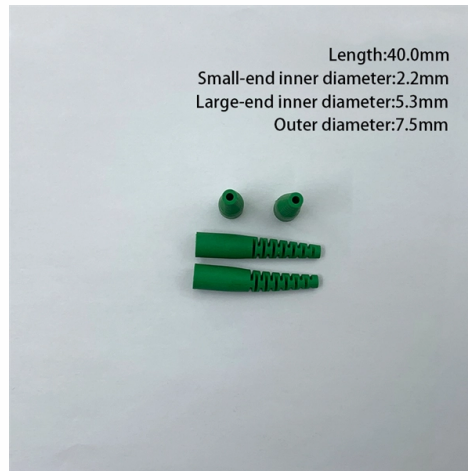


Types of Fiber Optic Cable Tools

Proper preparation is critical before splicing or termination. Key tools include:

- Cable jacket strippers: Remove the outer sheath without damaging fibers inside.
- Buffer tube strippers: Strip the protective coating around individual fibers.
- Precision fiber cleavers: Produce a flat, mirror-smooth end face for splicing, minimizing signal loss.
- Lint-free wipes and isopropyl alcohol: Clean fibers to remove dust, oils, and contaminants .

Splicing and Termination Tools

Splicing ensures low-loss, high-strength connections:

- Fusion splicers: Align and fuse fiber ends using an electric arc; core-alignment models offer higher precision.
- Mechanical splicers: Provide temporary or semi-permanent connections.

- Splice sleeves and sleeve heaters: Protect and reinforce fusion splices .
- Testing and Troubleshooting Tools

Testing tools verify network integrity and locate faults:

- Optical Time-Domain Reflectometers (OTDRs): Pinpoint breaks, splices, and faults, measure distance, reflectance, and total fiber loss.
- Power meters and light sources: Measure signal strength and insertion loss at specific wavelengths.
- Visual Fault Locators (VFLs): Use visible red laser light to detect breaks, bends, or bad splices .

Stripping, Cutting, and Handling Tools

Specialized tools ensure safe and precise handling:

- Three-hole or multi-stage strippers: Remove coatings without damaging the 125µm glass core.
- Kevlar scissors: Cut aramid yarn or Kevlar strength members cleanly.
- Heavy-duty shears: Cut cable jackets and strength members efficiently .

Cleaning and Inspection Tools

Maintaining clean connectors is essential for signal quality:

- One-click cleaners, cleaning sticks, and IPA pens: Clean connector end faces and adapters.
- Inspection scopes: Check for dirt, scratches, or defects on fiber ends .

Additional Tools and Accessories

- Cable identifiers and non-intrusive testers: Detect signal direction and live traffic.
- Cable ties, Velcro straps, and management panels: Organize cables to prevent tangling and damage.
