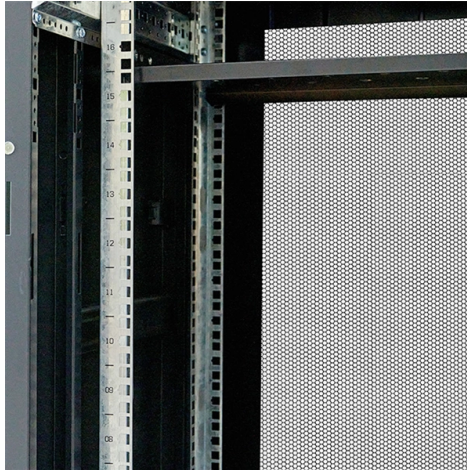


What does two out of three mean in relay protection

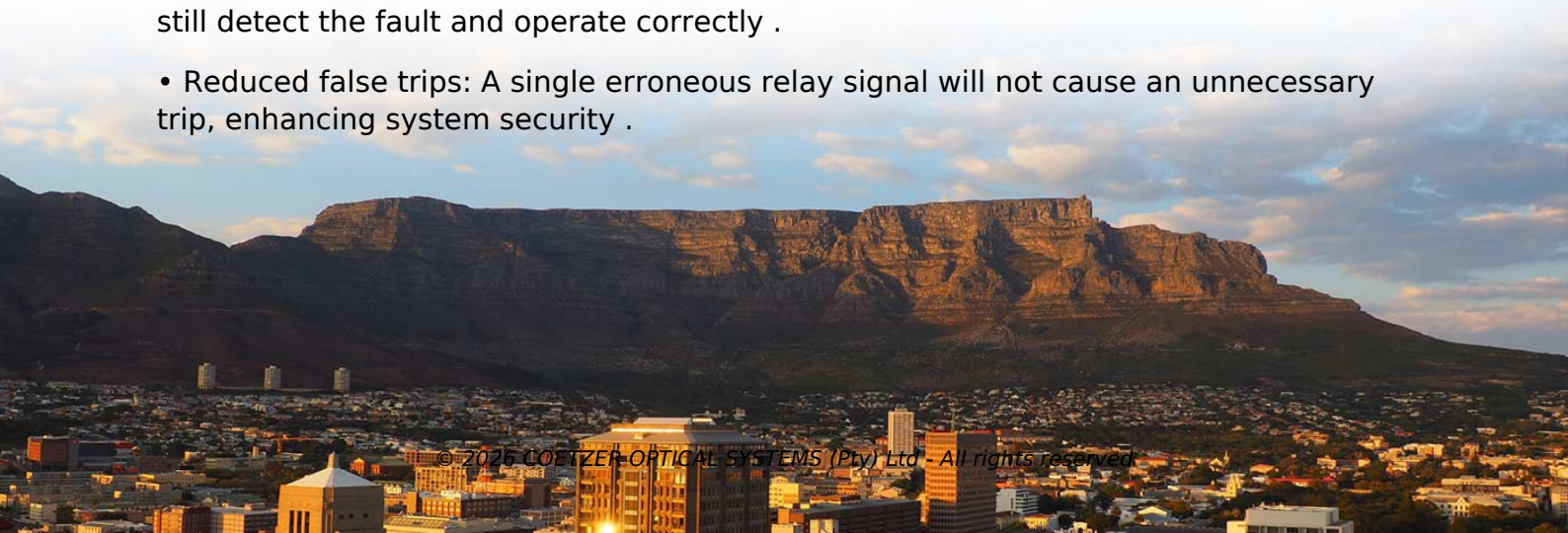

Concept and Purpose
In power system protection, redundancy and reliability are critical. The "two out of three" scheme is a voting logic used when three relays monitor the same electrical parameters, such as current or voltage, for a particular line or transformer. Each relay independently evaluates whether a fault exists. The system will only initiate a trip if at least two of the three relays agree that a fault is present, providing a balance between dependability and security .

Advantages

- Increased dependability: Even if one relay fails or malfunctions, the other two can still detect the fault and operate correctly .
- Reduced false trips: A single erroneous relay signal will not cause an unnecessary trip, enhancing system security .



- Redundancy: All three relays are fully capable of detecting faults independently, so the system does not rely on a single device .

Implementation

- Relays can be connected in series or parallel, depending on the logic used for the final trip decision .
- This scheme is commonly applied in transmission systems, where high reliability is essential.
- The "two out of three" logic is part of a broader voting scheme, which can also include other configurations like "majority voting" or "one-out-of-two" depending on system requirements .

Practical Example

Consider a transmission line protected by three distance relays. If a fault occurs:

- Relay A detects the fault.
- Relay B detects the fault.
- Relay C does not detect the fault (perhaps due to a temporary measurement error). Since two relays (A and B) agree, the system issues a trip command, isolating the faulted section. If only one relay had detected the fault, no trip would occur, preventing unnecessary outages . In summary, the "two out of three" scheme is a reliable and widely used method in protective relaying to ensure that trips occur only when there is sufficient evidence of a fault, combining redundancy with operational security.
