- **External Grounding:** The distribution box is connected to a grounding rod or central grounding system, which provides a low-resistance path to earth. The resistance between system parts is maintained below 0.1 Ohm for effective grounding (Atlas Copco) .

Standards and Safety

- Grounding wires must meet regional standards: for example, 10 AWG in the US or 6 mm² elsewhere (Atlas Copco) .
- Regular testing of grounding resistance is recommended to ensure safety, with a maximum resistance of 25 Ohms for reliable operation (Coloria Group) .
- Proper grounding prevents electrical surges, short circuits, and potential fire hazards, making it a critical feature of any distribution box (Selhot Electric) .
