- 150-amp panels: Found in mid-20th-century homes, offering moderate capacity for additional appliances, though some designs (split-buss) may create bottlenecks .
- 200-amp panels: Standard for new construction and modern homes, providing ample capacity for central air, electric cooking, EV chargers, and other high-demand systems .

Choosing the correct panel size depends on:

- Home square footage: Larger homes generally require higher amperage to support more circuits .
- Appliance load: High-draw appliances like electric ovens, heat pumps, or EV chargers increase demand .
- Future expansion: Planning for additional circuits or upgrades ensures the panel remains adequate over time .

An undersized panel can lead to frequent breaker trips, overloaded circuits, and fire hazards, while an oversized panel provides room for growth and accommodates modern electrical demands safely .
