Bundled fiber optic patch cords, also known as fan-out or breakout cables, are designed to connect multiple fibers from a single trunk to individual ports on network equipment. The interface is usually at the connector end, which can be LC duplex connectors for high-density applications or MPO/MTP connectors for multi-fiber trunk connections. These connectors are inserted into patch panels, optical distribution frames, or directly into transceivers on switches, routers, or servers.

In data centers, bundled patch cords are often terminated at high-density fiber patch panels. For example, Cisco's patch panels support MPO-to-LC breakout cables, allowing a single MPO trunk to split into multiple LC connections for individual devices . The front side of the panel typically hosts the LC connectors for client devices, while the rear side accommodates the MPO trunk cables from the backbone or aggregation network . This setup ensures organized cable management, easy access, and scalability for high-speed networks.

Connector Types

- LC Connectors: Small form factor, push-pull latch, widely used for SFP/SFP+/QSFP modules, ideal for high-density racks .

- MPO/MTP Connectors: Multi-fiber connectors that bundle 12 or 24 fibers, used for trunk lines and breakout applications .

Practical Considerations

- Bundled patch cords are available in single-mode (SMF) or multi-mode (MMF) depending on distance and bandwidth requirements .

- They often include Kevlar reinforcement and color-coded jackets for durability and easy identification .

- The interface location is always at the connector ends, which plug into either patch panels or directly into optical modules on network devices, enabling flexible and rapid deployment .
