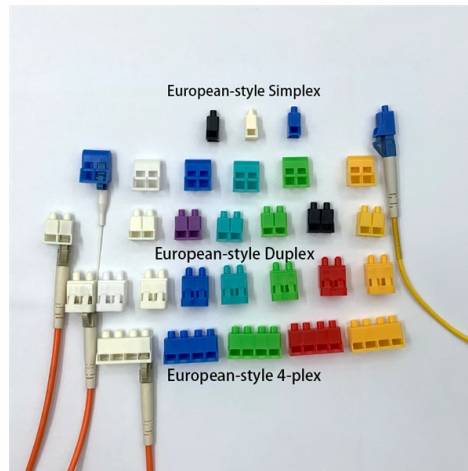


Wiring connection for electrical cabinet
